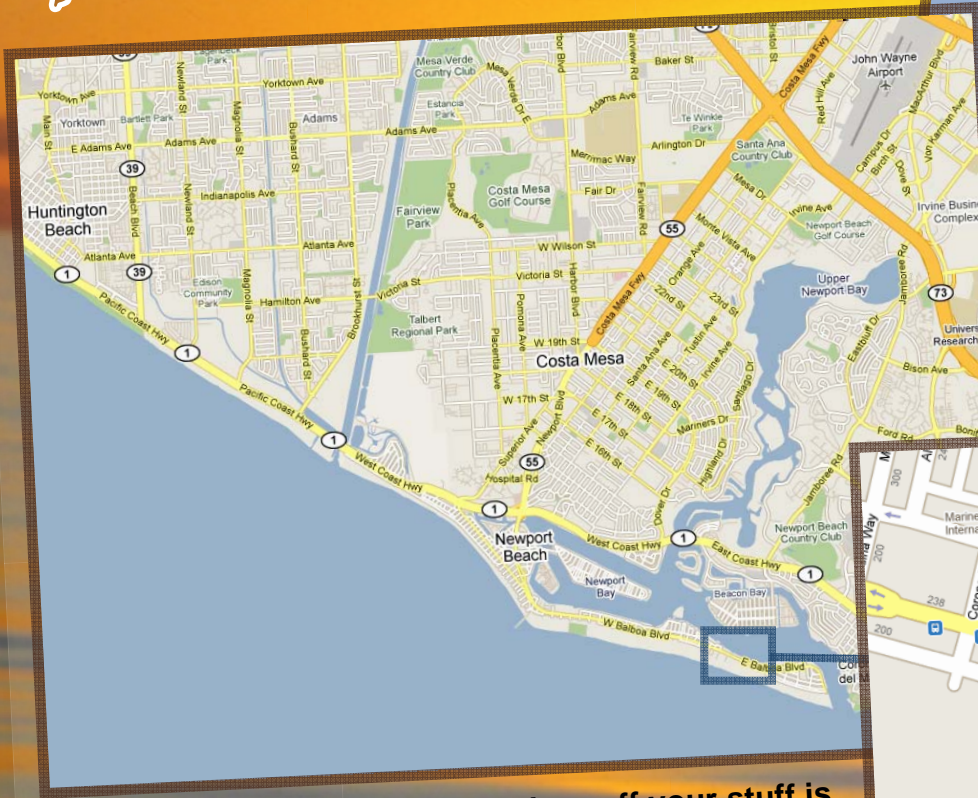
Mark your luggage with a yellow ribbon (for GCN) and place it in the staging area when you arrive at the dock. A few dads will watch kids while the rest of the dads load luggage onto the boat. When we arrive at Two Harbors, the same process is used to unload the luggage to the end of the dock. There it is picked up and trucked to the campground near site #20. You'll pick it up from there, and walk it to your camp area. Many dads find that rolling trash cans are a convenient way to transport gear. Whatever luggage you bring, make sure it's well identified, easy for you to recognize, and something you can move up and down ramps and hills easily.

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GETTING TO THE BOAT



The most convenient place to drop off your stuff is at the corner of Main and E Bay. The earlier you arrive the easier this will be. Finding a spot on the curb gets to be a challenge close to departure time. There is a large parking lot near the Balboa pier (see map) where you can leave your car if you're not getting dropped off (\$15/day).

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CHECKING IN



When you arrive at Balboa Pavilion:

Bring your luggage to the gathering area and check in with the event coordinator. You'll receive wrist bands that are required to get on the boat. You'll also receive yellow ribbon to place on all of your luggage. This ribbon will determine where your luggage gets dropped off at the campground. GCN (yellow tagged) luggage will be dropped off near campsite #20.

When you arrive at the Island:

Dads will unload the luggage to the end of the pier. From there it will be trucked to the campground. There is a $\frac{1}{4}$ mile walk to the campground (path shown below). Your tribe chief should know which campsites you're headed for.

FOOD

Dinner on Friday, breakfast and dinner on Saturday, and breakfast on Sunday will be served in camp at site 20. Tribes are on their own for Saturday lunch. You can grab snacks at the store, eat at one of the restaurants, or bring food from home. Menu options have not been finalized, but typical breakfast includes eggs, bacon, cereal, milk, orange juice and coffee. Typical dinner includes lasagna or tacos, salad, mac & cheese, mashed potatoes, bread, and a treat with Gatorade and water. You might want to bring additional snack food if your brave is a picky eater, because while the food is generally very good, options at each meal are limited.

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ACCOMMODATIONS

There are sinks, drinking fountains, and outdoor showers in the campground as well as pit toilets. Indoor coin operated showers and flush toilets can be found in Two Harbors ¼ mile from the campground. Campsites have fire pits and picnic tables. There is a small store in Two Harbors that sells snack foods, beverages, ice, ice cream, and camp items you may have forgotten. A truck generally comes through the campground a few times selling wood for your campfire.

FISHING DERBY

There is great fishing in Two Harbors, most braves that go fishing will catch fish. Bait tickets will be provided to each tribe to redeem at the store in town. Report your tribe results to the Seminoles before dinner on Saturday, and the three braves in each age group who catch the best fish will receive a brand new fishing rod and reel. If you're not a pro fisherman, but want your brave to catch a fish, you can get everything you need at a local sporting goods store for a few bucks. Bring a rod & spinning reel with 10 lb. test, size 4 circle hooks and/or size 8 hooks, a 1 ounce weight to get to the bottom, and small swivels. With that stuff in hand, Nation Chief White Ankles or many of the other dads can help get your brave fishing like a pro.

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ALTERNATE TRAVEL PLANS

If you're not able to make it to the boat on Friday afternoon, need to leave early, or would like to stay later, feel free to arrange alternate travel plans. **Since the Catalina Flyer cost is fixed, and built into the per person price, we can't give rebates to those who don't use it.** However, for those who need to leave later on Friday, the Catalina Express has a boat that departs San Pedro for Two Harbors at 7:00 PM (www.catalinaexpress.com) 800-481-3470. Note that trash cans are not allowed on this boat. If you want to show up (or depart) like a rock star on your own schedule, you can reserve helicopter transportation for \$94/person (www.islandexpress.com) 800-228-2566. Private boats are also an option for those who have them and understand the mooring process.

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
