

## Two Harbors Packing List

### Suggestions

- Wheels on heavy gear helps loading/unloading. No wheeled trashcans allowed.
- No electricity in camp so leave corded electronics at home and make sure your rechargeable gear is fully charged before the trip.
- No hot showers in camp. Hot showers are available 1 mile away in town. Most kids/dads might shower once the whole trip if they are lucky, and many not at all.
- Bring an extra pair of shoes for the kids in case one gets wet. Bring changes of clothes as you see fit, but resist the temptation to bring too much.
- Indian Gear: The GCN recommends leaving all big Indian gear at home to lighten the gear load. This means headdresses, lances, tom toms, etc. Just make sure you bring your Tribe T-shirts, sweatshirts, hats so we can show our colors loud and proud!
- All meals at Two Harbors will be provided. Bring snacks and drinks for non-meal time, but resist the temptation to bring too much food.
- Do not bring fuel on the boat.
- Two Harbors has a small general store where you can buy most goods so don't worry about missing a few non-essential items.
- Lend/share extra gear with your Tribe members who are not frequent campers.

### Primary Gear

- € Tent, rain fly, stakes, tarp (for ground)
- € Air mattresses & pump
- € Sleeping bags & pillows (or bring an extra case and make your own)
- € General – trash bags, bungee cord tie downs
- € Fishing poles and tackle boxes (live bait available in town)
- € Swimsuit, water shoes, towel
- € Flashlights and extra batteries
- € Camera
- € Change of clothes and something long sleeved for evenings (check weather before trip)
- € Light jacket (again, check the weather before trip)
- € Extra pair of shoes/socks for kids
- € Sunglasses, sunblock, and hat
- € Toothbrush/paste, soap/shampoo, other toiletries
- € Snacks, juices/soda, Gatorade, other beverages

€ Water, water, water

€ Cups

#### Optional Gear

€ Light folding chairs (strongly suggested if you don't already have too much to haul as we will only have picnic tables to sit on)

€ Games, football, Frisbee, baseball

€ Water balloons (caution - sometimes they frown on these due to the debris)

€ Glow sticks for the kids to play with at night

€ Walkie Talkies, GPS, Binoculars

€ Telescope

€ Earplugs if you are a light sleeper

€ Small backpacking stove and gourmet coffee/hot chocolate if you can't stand camp coffee

€ Cigars

€ Cooler (if you insist on ice cold drinks and don't mind hauling)

Shared Tribe Gear – we will need to figure out who brings what and if we as a group want to BBQ a special late night meal or arrange a tribe stove for coffee or what

€ Host Tribe – Games, awards, tally sheets, and clipboards

€ Lantern for tribe communal area

€ Tribe stove and pot?

€ Rope

€ Paper towels

€ Marshmallows & skewers

€ Newspaper to start our evening fire

€ Something to throw on someone else's BBQ – heck if you brought the cooler why not? (no doubt one or two tribes will end up bringing carne asada or something to BBQ late at night)

€ Knives, forks, paper plates for the tribal late night BBQ

€ Decorate the chief gear of your tribe is participating
